About the John Wornall House

Originally built as the farmstead home of a prosperous family, the John Wornall House also served as a field hospital during the Civil War's Battle of Westport, sometimes known as the "Gettysburg of the West." The Wornall family was caught in the middle of many struggles, on the border of Kansas and Missouri and Union and Confederate. The house, built in 1858, remained a family home for over 100 years before becoming a museum, and retains the original character and memory of its nineteenth century roots. The Wornall House is now home to many beloved Kansas City traditions, including Ghost Tours and holiday Candlelight Tours.



About the Alexander Majors House

Alexander Majors lived a remarkable life as a businessman, pioneer freighter, co-founder of the Pony Express, and an early commercial founder of Kansas City. His freighting firm Russell, Majors & Waddell briefly held a virtual monopoly on all government freighting west of the Mississippi. His work opened the western United States for travel, communication, and commerce. He built the Majors House in 1856 as the logistics center of his massive freighting business. The Majors property also includes the Alexander Majors Barn, built on the footprint of a barn originally located on the property, which serves as a rental facility and Museum event space.
